Music Appreciation & Development

All children learn through play and exploration. By presenting music in a fun and engaging environment, children can learn about rhythm, tone and dynamics even in the simplest song! Although all children are born with the potential to become music makers, their abilities must be nurtured in a rich musical environment.

Group Participation: Singing & Instrument Play

Starting from the first cry, coo or babble children are constantly exploring the sound of their own voice. Just as specific speech sounds and patterns develop, so too does the ability to create tonal patterns.

In addition to the joy of singing, children also love exploring a wide variety of musical instruments. Playing triangles, chimes, drums, rhythm sticks, and more will allow your child to create his / her own music and musical style!
